Dear PIKO fans,

2024 will be a special year for us: it will be dedicated to the 75th anniversary of the PIKO brand. We look forward to celebrating our anniversary with you!

On this occasion, in addition to limited edition models, an updated chronicle will be published that tells our story from "Pioneer Konstruktion" days to the present.

This year's main new HO model will be the Class 62 steam locomotive. Its level of construction is on-par with the Class 03 steam locomotive. The elegant new model will appear this year in Bundesbahn and Reichsbahn versions. The Expert Plus version will be even more exquisite.

PIKO fans can usually count on an old-style electric locomotive to be among the new models. We are happy to live up to this expectation and look forward to an E 44 in 2024. What's more - as a unique model - we will first deliver the DB's pre-production engine #144 001. Naturally, fans of the Deutsche Reichsbahn will be offered a DR version.

Perhaps the most exciting and definitely the most extensive project in 2024 will be an HO model of the Metropolitan train. Together with our partners at Märklin we will offer the full 1:87 scale train in exacting quality. Märklin will offer the AC version and PIKO the DC version. Of course, a matching Class 101 electric locomotive will be part of the composition. This is the first time PIKO and Märklin have collaborated on the development of a completely new model.

In addition to the above mentioned highlights, you can expect further all-new models and assorted fresh variants, some of which have never been offered in HO scale. Take a look for yourself on the following pages.

DR**The prototype:**

The BR 62 was the result of efforts by the Reichsbahn Central Office to develop a series of multipurpose standard locomotives. Based on the BR 20 (which was never built), engineers designed a fast two-cylinder superheated steam locomotive with a 4-6-4T wheel arrangement. A contract to build the engines was awarded to the Henschel company, who in 1928 completed fifteen locomotives. Initially, the DRG took delivery of just 62 001 and 62 002 and used them in the Ruhr area. The remaining 13 engines were not put into service until 1932.

Soon after, they found their natural home on the demanding Werra Railroad between Eisenach and Lichtenfels. Following the Second World War, seven engines remained in the western zones while eight remained in the East. The Deutsche Bundesbahn restored its BR 62s to operational condition in 1949 and used them in commuter service in the Ruhr area until 1956. In 1972, engine 62 1007-4 was the last of its kind to retire from scheduled service. Today 62 015 can be seen as a museum locomotive in Dresden.

The model:

The powerful all-new model from PIKO is robust yet refined. The beefy outline of the prototype was captured perfectly in our 1:87 scale offering. Thanks to its exquisite bar frame and airy suspension, the massive boiler appears to float atop the chassis. This impression is reinforced by the fine spoked wheels, free-standing, individually-applied piping and full brake linkage. The attention to detail continues in the locomotive cab. Crystal-clear windows and an unobstructed interior allow for a clear view of the detailed boiler backhead and rear cab wall.

The BR 62's die-cast zinc and metal construction give the model a high weight, which in combination with the flywheel-equipped motor ensures optimal running qualities. Factory-equipped digital versions feature switchable, authentic cab lighting and running gear lights along with controllable firebox flicker. Of course, these functions are available on the analog model after adding a PluX22 decoder. The Expert Plus version also has digitally-activated couplers and a puffing smoke generator synchronized with each turn of the drive wheels.

The prototype:

In 2019, Siemens Mobility presented a dual power locomotive known as the Vectron Dual Mode that has both electric and diesel propulsion. The Vectron Dual Mode can be used in a more flexible and resource-saving way by not being dependant on the presence of catenary. By reducing the size of the diesel tank, space was made available for the main transformer. Siemens offers the locomotives in two variants: the Vectron Dual Mode, known in Germany as the BR 248, and the Vectron Dual Mode light, known as the BR 249. While the BR 248 is equipped with an MTU diesel engine and has a 22.5 ton axle load, the BR 249 uses a smaller engine from Cummins and has a 21 ton axle load. In 2020, DB Cargo concluded a framework agreement for up to 400 Dual Mode units, which will be used to upgrade its locomotive fleet. At present, 150 locomotives have been delivered.

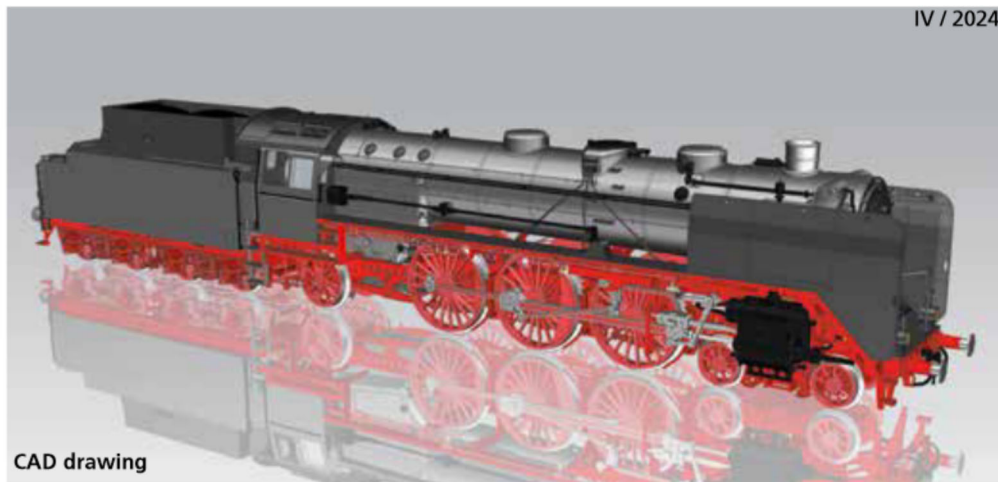

The model:

Broad side panels and large intake screens along with a rooftop pantograph leave no doubt you are looking at the Vectron Dual Mode. The all-new PIKO 1:87 model pays tribute to this modern locomotive. In the development of tooling for the model, great emphasis was placed on details like the ventilation grilles and truck sideframes. Operationally the model continues in the tradition of proven PIKO designs. A dual flywheel-equipped can motor powers all four axles. Diagonally-mounted traction tires help the Dual Mode to pull long trains on your layout. In digital operation, the cab lighting can be activated along with illuminated engineer's control desks. The XP version features a pulsated smoke generator, and for the first time ever on a PIKO model; a digitally-activated pantograph that can be raised and lowered.

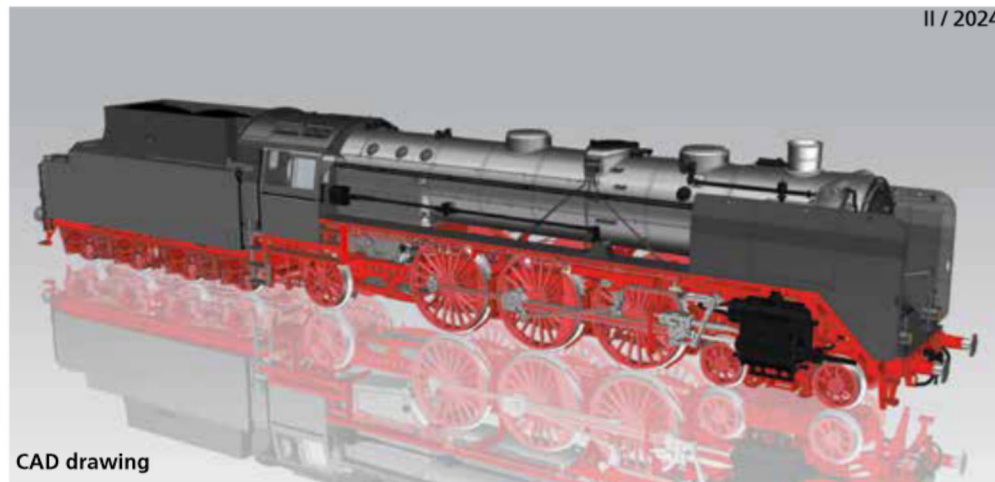

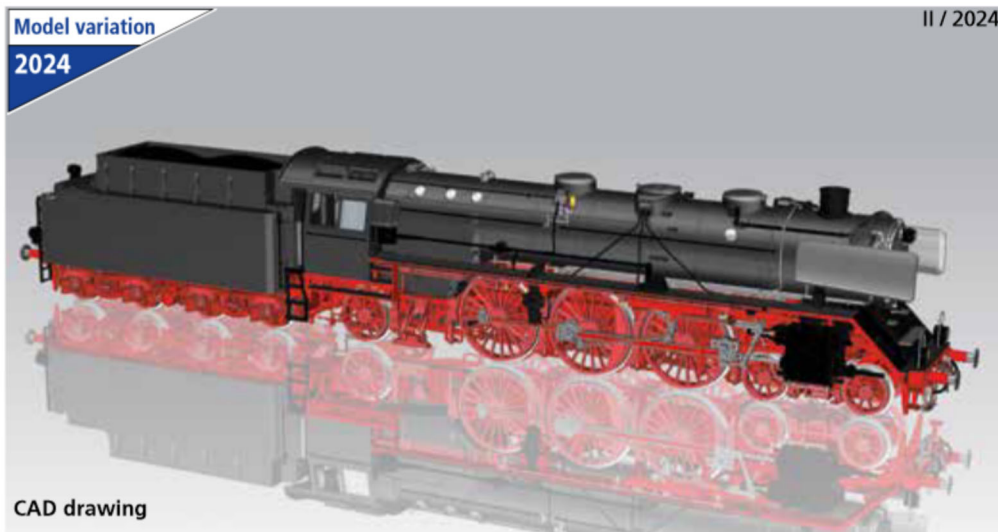

The model:

An authentic model of DB's Era III BR 03 steam locomotive has now arrived. Just like the 1:1 BR 03, the PIKO model has four large leading wheels and triple headlights, along with a see-through bar frame and prototypically-accurate "scissor" brakes. It's handsome appearance is completed by razor-sharp lettering and the painted-on locomotive number.

The prototype:

The success story that was the E 44 electric locomotives began in 1930 when Siemens-Schuckertwerke delivered the prototype, E 44-001, to the DRG. The new design was the first German electric locomotive to have each axle powered by a traction motor, a design that remains the standard today. Serial production began in 1932 with units delivered by Krauss-Maffei, Henschel & Sohn and the Floridsdorf locomotive factory. Following the Second World War, the locomotives that remained in the Soviet occupation zone were given to the USSR as reparations. In the mid-1950s, forty-six engines were returned to the GDR in dilapidated condition and needed extensive refurbishment. The locomotives were originally used in Central Germany but were later assigned to Rostock, Schwerin and Wismar. By the mid-1980s, 23 engines were still operational; with the last ten locomotives being retired in 1991. In 1949, the young Federal Railroad had a total of 125 E44s on its roster, including two converted units and seven rebuilt units. The DB's fleet was limited to operation in the south of the Federal Republic. Designated class 144 since 1968, the last locomotives were retired from the Würzburg depot in 1984.

The model:

Like its 1:1 counterpart, the PIKO E 44 is also a success story. For the first time, a major manufacturer is offering an HO version of the pre-production locomotive, E 44 001, later 144 001-5. PIKO's new models of the pre-production and series production engines are accurate representations of their originals. Both feature exceptionally detailed bodies highlighted by sharply engraved intake grills and flush-mounted crystal clear windows. The detail continues to each model's chassis with numerous hand-applied parts on each truck sideframe. Operationally, the model leaves nothing to be desired: A proven PIKO drive makes for smooth running while the PluX22 digital interface allows for the easy installation of a decoder. When converted to DCC operation it is possible to activate cab lighting and engine room lights. DCC Sound versions feature the typical "growl" of the E 44's Tatzlager drive.

The prototype:

The Dutch State Railroads' class 1000 electric locomotives were based on the SBB Ae 4/6. Unlike their Swiss AC counterparts, the class 1000s were built to run on the Dutch DC network. Originally planned for express train service between major Dutch cities, they were used from 1948 – 1982 almost exclusively in freight train service. The design of the locomotives was found unsuitable for 100+ km/h express train traffic, which caused them to run hot and therefore be unreliable.

Of the ten locomotives manufactured, 1010 is the only one that has been preserved and can be seen at the Railroad Museum in Utrecht.

The model:

Despite their technical shortcomings, the Class 1000 electric locomotives were visually very appealing. Their appearance reflects a touch of the streamlined age. This was both an incentive and a challenge for the PIKO design team. The side panels of the stylish locomotive are marked by finely engraved intake grills and crystal-clear, flush-fitting engine room windows. Two pantographs are perched atop the unit's sleek roofline while an intricately detailed chassis with fine spoked wheels peeps out from under the body. Mechanically, the PIKO model stands in stark contrast to the prototype: a solid drive guarantees smooth performance and reliable pulling power. At the heart of the model stands a state-of-the-art motherboard with a PluX22 interface. Digital versions feature numerous realistic sound and LED lighting effects.

The prototype:

In the early 1980s, the PKP realized the need for an express locomotive that could meet the demands of 160 km/h passenger traffic between Warsaw and Krakow. The EP05 series locomotives (converted from the EU05 from 1973 onwards) were limited in number and past their prime. Pafawag in Breslau answered the call for a new express locomotive by constructing the all-new 104E, which they presented in 1986 as the EP09 001. Second prototype followed a year later. The engines fully met the expectations placed on them, and by 1997 PKP had acquired 45 more units. The last ten featured air-conditioned cabs. The EP09 has served in numerous roles and has nearly replaced the EP05. Their widespread use has also affected the EP08, which is now only used on slower speed routes. Due to budget restrictions, the EP09s remained the defacto power on luxury express trains between Krakow – Warsaw and Warsaw-Berlin until 2008. It was only with the introduction of the EU44 that the EP09 gradually disappeared from express service. Nonetheless, almost the entire class is still in service with the PKP.

The model:

PIKO's brand-new EP09 marks the first time the EP09 has been offered in HO scale by a major manufacturer. It no doubt fulfills the wishes of many model railroaders – not just in Poland - for an accurate, high-quality model of this notable Polish locomotive. The characteristically angular lines of the EP09 have been successfully implemented on the model while it's smooth sides are complimented by a host of fine details. The PIKO Expert model presents excellent carbody detail like the intricate ventilation grills as well as it's highly-detailed roof and meticulous truck sideframes. It's excellent running qualities are the result of a heavy diecast frame and flywheel- equipped motor, which can be further enhanced by the addition of a digital sound decoder. The model's handsome appearance is rounded off by sharp and clear paint and lettering.

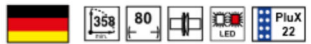
The prototype:

The DE 18 diesel-electric locomotives from Vossloh Rolling Stock GmbH are used for heavy switching and mainline service. With a top speed of 120 km/h and an 1800 kW continuous output, they are currently the most powerful center cab locomotives on the European market. The locomotives feature a modular design that can be adapted to specific applications based on the customer's requirements. Since its launch in 2014, over 130 engines have been sold, including some to the freight division of Luxembourg Railroads (CFL Cargo), the French SNCF/Geodis subsidiary AKIEM, and various private railroads. There are also a few units in Vossloh's own fleet.

The model:

Diesel locomotives are a big part of the image of today's rail freight traffic. It's therefore only natural that Vossloh's imposing DE 18 should be a part of that picture. PIKO's design team has once again captured the essence of a modern freight engine in the all-new HO scale replica. The model features a wealth of details like finely engraved intake grills and highly accurate truck frames. A powerful motor with dual flywheels ensures smooth operation while two diagonally arranged traction tires increase pulling power. The model's digital decoder allows for numerous prototypical sound and lighting functions like an illuminated engineer's control stand and a lighted cab.

PIKO turns 75!



In 2024, it will be 75 years since the first Pico Express (yes, back then PIKO was spelled with a „c“) made its rounds at the Leipzig Autumn Fair. Time to pause for a moment and take a quick look back.

Production has been based in the toy town of Sonneberg since 1952. So, it should come as no surprise that we are deeply rooted in the region. Over the years, VEB PIKO first became the lead company of the Piko Spielwaren combine and later the product group lead company for model trains of the Sonneberg toy combine. The combine was dissolved following reunification in 1990. Fortunately, the planned liquidation of the company was prevented by the takeover of the company by Dr. René F. Wilfer in May 1992.

The prototype:

The luxurious Metropolitan Express Trains (MET) operated between Cologne and Hamburg from 1999 until 2004. The push-pull trains were powered by one of four Class 101 electric locomotives customized for MET service. Unlike other DB AG passenger trains, the Metropolitan was not divided into classes. Instead, the cars were divided into different categories: 2 Quiet cars, 3 Office cars and 2 Club cars. Each car was first class and featured wooden trim, leather seats and brushed stainless steel ceiling panels.

The prototype:

Between 1971 and 1973, a four-axle car with telescoping hoods was developed for transporting moisture-sensitive sheet metal coils. In 1976, LHB (Linke-Hoffmann-Busch) built a prototype car based on this design for the Federal Railroad, which classified it as the Shis 708. The car featured five troughs with space for coils weighing up to 45 tons a piece. The aluminum hoods could be opened from either end of the car, and would always reveal 2/3 of the cargo area. This successful design convinced the Federal Railroad to purchase a total of 2,680 cars, which from 1987 onward were classified as Shimmns 708. The Deutsche Reichsbahn also received a total of 290 cars between 1992 and 1994, which were delivered by LHB, Waggonbau Dessau and Niesky. These cars were classified as Shimmns. Over the course of their lives, the cars have been repeatedly modified for

The model:

In their usual high standards of quality, PIKO has created an accurate HO scale replica of this well-known and visually appealing freight car. Several versions of the car have been modeled with great attention to detail. The impressive model features a number of individually attached parts and a detailed car floor. specific areas of use. For example, 750 cars had rubber mats applied to their troughs for transporting aluminum coils, while others were given retaining devices for unbundled coils. From 2002 onwards, more than 1000 cars were stripped of their telescopic hoods and given sliding tarp covers and reclassified as Shimmns-ttu 722. DB AG currently has over 400 cars of this type in its inventory. PIKO has reproduced several highly-detailed versions of this well-known and visually appealing freight car. The proportions of the 1:1 prototype have been duplicated on the 1:87 replica thanks to tool making of the highest order and fine injection molding. The impressive model features numerous individually-applied parts and a detailed car floor. A generous weight gives it excellent running qualities. The model's appearance is completed by accurate and crisp paint and lettering.
